Freedom West's First Annual Grocery Giveaway

Helping those in need this holiday season.

The first annual Freedom West Holiday Grocery Giveaway was a huge success, with more than 180 grocery bags given to local residents and families in time for the winter holidays.

event on Thursday,
December 9,
where senior

residents were surprised with fresh bags of produce, dry goods and other items dropped off at their door. About 50 bags of groceries were hand delivered over the course of the day.

On Saturday, December 11, the Freedom West Alumni Association hosted a daylong festivity as part of its grocery giveaway. A group of 15 volunteers handed out approximately 130 grocery bags of food, including more than 90 turkeys. In addition to the food giveaway, attendees enjoyed DJs, music and custom wreath making workshops. There was a bounce house for children, along with hot chocolate, pastries and other offerings.

The Freedom West Alumni Association helped raise money for the groceries, while also getting donations and support from the African American Art and Culture Complex, UR Blessings, Holiday Food Box Program and Bi-Rite Grocery.
